Dusty was born on April 7th, 2020 into a band of wild ponies that reside on Assateague Island, Virginia. Every year, on the last Wednesday in July, the wild ponies swim across a channel to Chincoteague Island, Virginia where they are escorted to the carnival grounds by

members of the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Department, known as the The Saltwater Cowboys. The ponies are owned and cared for by the fire department. Since they are only allowed to keep 150 ponies on Assateague's wildlife preserve, they auction off most of the new foals at the carnival grounds on the day after the swim in order to control the population and raise money for new equipment. Miss Lauren has been visiting the island since she was seven and it has been a lifelong dream of hers to one day own a Chincoteague Pony of her very own. In 2015, she met and bonded with Dusty's mom, Pixie Dust, who endured many hardships on the island. Her mother died shortly after her birth and she was sent to a nearby farm until she was old enough to survive on her own. When she returned to the island she was shunned by the rest of the ponies and was always alone. She eventually formed her own posse. In 2018, she had her 1st foal and two months later, he sustained a broken leg and had to be euthanized. She had her 2nd foal last April. Miss Lauren bid on and won him at the auction in July. She has been training him to work in our ground program. On February 16th, the Board voted to add Dusty to our team of therapy horses. Please join us in welcoming him to our herd! He is very social, so make sure to stop by and say hello the next time you are at the farm!
