





Albany Therapeutic Riding Center: The Lehman Legacy

IN MEMORY OF CHRISTINE D. LEHMAN



ACCORDING TO INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM AN OBITUARY BY TEBBUTT & FREDERICK MEMORIAL HOME POSTED ON THE SCOTT & BARBIERI FAMILY FUNERAL HOMES WEBSITE. AND ONE WRITTEN BY MELISSA HALE-SPENCER WHICH WAS PUBLISHED IN THE ALTAMONT ENTERPRISE ON JANUARY 6. 2017. CHRISTINE 'CHRIS' LEHMAN WAS BORN MAY 29.1945 IN NORMAN. OKLAHOMA WHILE HER PARENTS. STUART AND THELMA LUNDBERG LEHMAN. WERE STATIONED THERE WITH THE US NAVY DURING WORLD WAR II. AFTER THE WAR. THE FAMILY MOVED TO ALBANY. WHEN CHRIS WAS 14. HER PARENTS GOT HER A HORSE. SHE GRADUATED FROM ALBANY HIGH SCHOOL AND RECEIVED AN ASSOCIATES DEGREE FROM SUNY DELHI. ACCORDING TO MELISSA HALE-SPENCER. "JUST BEFORE SHE WENT TO COLLEGE AT SUNY DELHI TO BECOME A VETERINARY TECHNICIAN. HER FATHER BOUGHT A 90-ACRE FARM ON MARTIN ROAD IN NEW SCOTLAND. AT THE BASE OF THE HELDERBERG ESCARPMENT." THE OBITUARY POSTED BY TEBBUTT & FREDERICK MEMORIAL HOME SAID. CHRIS "WAS EMPLOYED BY COLONIE ANIMAL HOSPITAL AND LATER SERVED AS A LAB TECHNICIAN AT COLUMBIA-GREENE COMMUNITY COLLEGE, UNTIL SHE RETIRED. SHE WAS THE FOUNDER AND DRIVING FORCE OF THE ALBANY THERAPEUTIC RIDING CENTER [LOCATED ON MARTIN ROAD IN NEW SCOTLAND], WHERE SHE WAS THE PRESIDENT AND [A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF THERAPEUTIC HORSEMANSHIP INTERNATIONAL CERTIFIED] RIDING INSTRUCTOR FOR 35 YEARS." IN MAY 2013, THE DAILY GAZETTE AND DIRECT ENERGY NAMED CHRIS THE FIRST RECIPIENT OF THE CAPITAL REGION VOLUNTEER CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AWARD.

MELISSA HALE-SPENCER WROTE IN HER OBITUARY, "CHRISTINE D. LEHMAN LOVED ANIMALS ALL HER LIFE AND, THROUGH THEM, SHE SERVED PEOPLE. FOR 35 YEARS, MS. LEHMAN HELPED KIDS AND GROWN-UPS WITH DISABILITIES - SOME WHO COULDN'T WALK OR COULDN'T TALK - RIDE HORSES...IN 1975, MS. LEHMAN ATTENDED A SEMINAR IN VIRGINIA ON THERAPEUTIC RIDING, WHICH PIQUED HER INTEREST, SHE TOLD THE ENTERPRISE." ACCORDING TO HALE-SPENCER, CHRIS' BROTHER, STUART, SAID, "INITIALLY, MANY YEARS AGO, CHRIS SHOWED QUARTER HORSES AND TAUGHT REGULAR RIDING. SHE HAD A BUSINESS CALLED SUNRISE STABLES. SHE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST PEOPLE IN THE AREA TO BE CERTIFIED [AS A THERAPEUTIC RIDING INSTUCTOR]." HALE-SPENCER CONTINUED, "MS. LEHMAN HELPED SUSTAIN THE [THERAPEUTIC RIDING] CENTER WITH HER FULL-TIME JOB AS A BIOLOGY TECHNICIAN AT COLUMBIA-GREENE COMMUNITY COLLEGE...[AND] ALSO KEPT A PETTING ZOO WITH MANY DIFFERENT KINDS OF ANIMALS THAT SHE WOULD HIRE OUT TO RAISE FUNDS FOR HER RIDING CENTER...HER BROTHER DESCRIBED HER AS "VERY INDEPENDENT." HE SAID, "SHE SPENT MOST OF HER TIME ON THE FARM, TAKING CARE OF THE ANIMALS... SHE WAS CONTENT WITH THAT." HALE-SPENCER CONTINUED, "THE FARM WORK TOOK GRIT. MR. LEHMAN DESCRIBED THE COLD WIND<mark>s tha</mark>t would funnel through the farm at the base of the ESCARPMENT. "THE WIND WOULD SWEEP THROUGH IN THE WINTER AND FREEZE THE WATER IN THE BUCKETS. SHE'D HAVE TO CHOP THE ICE SO THE HORSES COULD DRINK. IF THERE'S A BLIZZARD, YOU'VE STILL GOT TO DO IT. THERE ARE NO DAYS OFF." ACCORDING TO MELISSA HALE-SPENCER, "IN 2013, WHEN SHE WON THE CAPITAL REGION VOLUNTEER CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AWARD, [CHRIS] TOLD THE ENTERPRISE, "IF THEY CAN GET ON A HORSE AND RIDE A HORSE, IF THEY CAN DO THAT, THEN MAYBE LIFE ISN'T SO SCARY. YOU TRANSFER WHAT YOU'RE DOING ON THE HORSE TO GENERAL LIFE GOALS."

IN A JUNE 8, 2006 COMMENTARY PIECE, "HORSES BRING PEACE AND PURPOSE TO RIDERS WHO CAST ASIDE CRUTCHES AND CAREGIVERS", WRITTEN FOR THE ALTAMONT ENTERPRISE, AUTHOR JO E. PROUT WROTE, "IF YOU FOLLOW THE TREE-LINED, UNPAVED MARTIN ROAD IN NEW SCOTLAND TO ITS END, AND WALK DOWN TO THE BOTTOM OF THE HILL AT THE BASE OF THE HELDERBERGS, YOU'LL FIND HORSES, LAUGHING STUDENTS, AND FRIENDLY FACES. FOR 25 YEARS, THE ALBANY THERAPEUTIC RIDING CENTER HAS BEEN NESTLED INTO OUR COLLECTIVE BACKYARD, DRAWING RIDERS FROM ALL OVER THE CAPITAL REGION, AND VOLUNTEERS OF ALL AGES. AS A LONGTIME VOLUNTEER AND BOARD MEMBER FOR THE RIDING CENTER, I'VE SEEN THE PEACE THAT SETTLES OVER THE RIDERS, WHO LEAVE CAREGIVERS AND CRUTCHES BEHIND AS THEY GUIDE THEIR HORSES AWAY FROM THE MOUNTING RAMP. ATOP A HORSE, THE RIDERS EXPERIENCE FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT AND THE THRILL OF SPORT, WITH THE HELP OF VOLUNTEERS WHO ACCOMPANY THEM. THE RIDING CENTER SERVES CHILDREN AND ADULTS WHO HAVE EMOTIONAL, PHYSICAL, OR MENTAL DISABILITIES. INSTRUCTOR CHRIS LEHMAN HAS SHARED HER PASSION FOR HORSES AND RIDERS SINCE SHE BEGAN THE CENTER A QUARTER CENTURY AGO. LEHMAN IS DIFFERENT FROM OTHER INSTRUCTORS I HAVE WORKED WITH...OTHER INSTRUCTORS LOVE HORSES, AND SHARE THEIR LOVE FOR HORSES WITH WILLING STUDENTS. LEHMAN LOVES HORSES, BUT THE DRIVE THAT HAS KEPT THE RIDING CENTER GOING FOR SO LONG INVOLVES HER LONG-TERM COMMITMENT TO, AND INTEREST IN, THE INDIVIDUAL RIDERS AND THE BENEFITS THEY DERIVE FROM HER LESSONS.

FOR THREE YEARS AFTER HER DEATH, CHRIS' BROTHER AND SISTER-IN LAW, STUART AND RUTH LEHMAN, GRACIOUSLY ALLOWED US TO CONTINUE TO OPERATE OUR THERAPEUTIC RIDING PROGRAM FROM THE MARTIN ROAD LOCATION. TO THIS DAY, THEY CONTINUE TO BE STAUNCH SUPPORTERS OF OUR ORGAIZATION AND WE ARE GRATEFUL FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT!

IT IS OUR HOPE TO HONOR CHRIS' MEMORY, BY CONTINUING TO CARRY OUT THE MISSION SHE STARTED FORTY YEARS AGO ON MARTIN ROAD IN NEW SCOTLAND AT OUR NEW FACILITY AND FOREVER HOME ON FULLER STATION ROAD IN ALTAMONT!

ACCORDING TO AN ARTICLE ON MILITARY.COM, "HOW HORSE THERAPY CAN HELP VETERANS", BY STEW SMITH, CSCS®, "THE SUCCESS OF HORSE THERAPY IS LARGELY DUE TO THE NATURE OF THE ANIMALS WITH WHICH THE VETERAN AND EQUINE THERAPIST ARE INTERACTING. THERAPY HORSES ARE NONJUDGMENTAL AND DO NOT HAVE EXPECTATIONS OR MOTIVES TOWARD THE PEOPLE WITH WHOM THEY CONNECT. AND HORSES HAVE A KEEN ABILITY TO UNDERSTAND THE ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIORS OF THE HUMANS THEY MEET...HORSES AND VETERANS ARE SIMILAR IN A FEW VERY IMPORTANT WAYS. THOUGH THE HORSE CANNOT SPEAK, IT IS KEEN TO UNDERSTAND A PERSON'S ACTIONS AND BODY LANGUAGE. BOTH THE VETERAN AND THE HORSE TEND TO BE HYPERVIGILANT OF THEIR SURROUNDINGS AND POTENTIAL DANGERS; BOTH CAN USE THE ACTIONS AND BODY LANGUAGE OF OTHERS TO DETERMINE SITUATIONS. THE HORSE ALSO CAN SENSE A VETERAN'S PAIN, ANXIETY AND FEARS, AND IS ABLE TO REACT TO THOSE FEELINGS IT IS PERCEIVING TO STEADY THE VETERAN'S ISSUES AT THAT MOMENT. I THINK, IN A WAY, THE HORSE CAN SENSE THE SACRIFICES OF THE PAST AND WILLINGNESS TO SACRIFICE FOR OTHERS IN THE VETERANS. THE HORSES ARE WILLING TO PUT THEIR TRUST IN SUCH A CREATURE, AND A RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN HORSE AND VETERAN IS BUILT ON THAT."
